We began our first adoption program in India, and over the years have developed many programs throughout the world and have placed thousands of orphaned children in their forever families.

We provide international adoption placement services to all U.S. citizens, regardless of the State they reside in.



Many of our staff members are also international adoptive parents. Because of this, they are well aware of the emotional feelings that go hand-in-hand with an adoption, and are very passionate about the children and countries they represent.

Children's House International's licensed social workers and registered counselors are experienced in educating and guiding families through the international adoption process. In other states, we will assist families as they locate and secure the services of a licensed Hague Accredited home study agency in their area.

Children's House International is accredited by the Honduran Central Authority as an adoption service provider. CHI works directly with the Secretaria de Ninez, Adolescencia y Familias (SENAF) who is Honduras' federal social services and also their Central Authority. We have a long history of working in Latin America and our International Specialist has 30 years of experience working there. We feel privileged to help many waiting Honduras children find their forever families.

We are anxious to help answer any questions you may have about this program.

**Parent Requirements:** In addition to the USCIS eligibility requirements for prospective adoptive parent(s), Honduras has the following adoption eligibility requirements:

- One Adoptive parent must be a US citizen.
- Heterosexual Couples between 25 to 51 years of age and married for at least 3 years may adopt a child.
- Adoptive parents must be at least 15 years older than the adoptive child. (In special circumstances, this may be waived if one parent falls within this range if the other does not.)
- Single women can also adopt. (Must be at least 15 years older than adopted child.)
- Honduras will accept no more than 2 divorces per applicant.
- Only one child may be adopted at one time unless they are siblings.
- Honduras gives preference to adoptive applicants that have less than 3 children currently in the home.



- Adoptive parents with minor health issues will be considered on a case by case basis. If adoptive parents take prescription medicine or have a medical condition, please contact our adoption consultant to determine your eligibility. Adoptive parents must demonstrate that they are physically, psychologically, and mentally fit to parent a child by adoption. A letter from a licensed physician and a psychological report will be required of each applicant and included in the home study report.
- Adoptive parents should have clean criminal history records to adopt from Honduras. Adoptive parents must disclose any and all criminal and drug history. If there was a minor criminal occurrence that happened a number of years ago, it will be reviewed to determine eligibility by our U.S. and in country staff/ attorney before application will be accepted on a case by case basis.
- There is no minimum income required. However, adoptive parents must satisfy state and home study agency requirements, as well as meet the income requirements provided by USCIS <https://www.uscis.gov/sites/default/files/files/form/i-864p.pdf>

## Travel for Adoption in Honduras:

Both parents must travel to Honduras for 2 trips.

The first trip is for approximately 5-10 days to meet the child they will be adopting. The second is for approximately 3 to 4 weeks after the adoption is final and comes 6 to 12 months after the first trip. Adoptive parents will be completing and signing paperwork. Both parents are required for this trips but there may be some flexibility if one needs to leave sooner.

Traveling and spending time with your new child in their birth country is truly *a life changing experience and one you can never duplicate.*

## Children available for adoption:

The children available for adoption in Honduras generally fall between 4 and 13 years of age. Sibling groups are available. Children with special needs are also in need of families. There are more boys available for adoption than girls.

**Time Frame:** In general, it can take 6 months to 2 years, for a referral from the time your dossier is received and approved by SENAF. The time frame also depends on how flexible you are with the age of child, special needs, etc. Adopting a child with few or no special needs under the age of 6 most likely will result in a longer wait time. Once you accept a referral, CHI will file the I800 with USCIS (this gives permission for your child to immigrate to the US after the adoption). You will then have a virtual meeting with SENAF and periodic virtual meetings with your child until the process is completed. The court process takes from 6 to 12 months. After the court process is complete, you will travel to Honduras for 3-4 weeks and bring our child home.

**Home Study:** If you live in Washington, Utah, Idaho, Louisiana, Texas or Florida, a CHI social worker will complete your home study. If you live outside these states, we will help you find a local agency social worker to prepare your home study.

A home study completed by an agency who is Hague accredited is required. Some states have more requirements than others. Six post placement reports from your social worker are required after your adoption within the first 2 years and then self reports until the child is 18 years old.

**Adoption Education and Required Educational Materials:** Children's House is dedicated to providing both information and support to our prospective parents. This educational requirement of at least 10 hours is mandatory. Your case manager and home study provider will help you select the courses most appropriate to your adoption. These courses are free through CHI..

### **Four steps to Begin an International Adoption:**

1. Complete your DocuSign that is sent to you which includes the Application packet and fee, the Agency Retainer Agreement, Financial Disclosure Agreement, and all other contractual forms to begin the adoption process through CHI.
2. Start your Home Study; take Adoption Education Courses and read suggested educational materials.
3. File the I-800A with USCIS along with having your fingerprints taken and submitted. Get your Passports and check to make sure your passports do not expire within 6 months of travel.
4. Gather Dossier documents and forward Dossier to CHI.

Your Children's House Team will be in constant contact with you during this entire process. We are here to help you and are looking forward to seeing your child in your arms. You will be sent comprehensive travel information and support from Children's House while you are in Honduras.
